"On Location on the Big Sur Coast"

A five-day acrylic workshop for artists of all skill levels

Monday, May 9 through Friday afternoon, May 13

Learn to use acrylics outdoors while exploring spectacular Brazil Ranch, former home of Allen Funt of Candid Camera fame and now part of Los Padres National Forest.

The 1250-acre ranch includes two miles of dramatic Big Sur coastline and views of the famous Bixby Creek Bridge, ranch buildings nestled high in the coastal hills, sweeping meadows, redwood groves and a duck pond. Marcia will focus on the technical aspects of using acrylics while emphasizing composition and intent. The Brazil Ranch Environmental Center provides educational programs on environmental conservation, stewardship and sustainability. All fees from this workshop will be donated to support the center's activities, educational programs and conservation projects. Workshop participants will stay in nearby Big Sur; lodging information will be sent upon registration.

Through exhibitions with The Oak Group and SCAPE, Marcia Burttt has helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars to preserve open spaces. She has been artist-in-residence at Yosemite National Park and her work has been included in exhibitions organized by a number of museums, including most recently the Haggin Museum in Stockton.

She is frequently mentioned in art publications, most recently in the April 2002 issue of *Southwest Art*; the May 2004 *Southwest Art*; and in the June 2004 *American Artist*.
